# How to dispute items on your Experian credit report



### **Getting started**

Step #1 Go to www.experian.com.

Step #2 From the "Consumer Assistance" tab, select "Disputes" from the dropdown menu.

Step #3 Select "Start a New Dispute Online," and click "Continue."

Step #4 Enter your report number, state, Social Security number and ZIP Code."

**Step #5** Under "terms and conditions," you are asked to verify that you are requesting your own report and the information you are providing is accurate and true.

Step #6 Click "Submit."



#### Tell us about it

**Step #7** Click on the item you wish to dispute from the dropdown menu.

Step #8 Click "Dispute This Item."

**Step #9** Select the reason for your dispute from the menu of common dispute reasons.

**Step #10** If necessary, provide additional details in the box. When complete, click "Submit Your Dispute."

Step #11 Review the dispute information and select "Yes, Submit My Dispute."

**Step #12** Provide an email address to which a notice will be sent when your dispute results are ready to be viewed online.
